HOW TO USE A FIRE EXTINGUISHER

The most important thing to remember if you discover a fire is to remain calm, think logically and raise the alarm.



If in doubt – it's best to get out, stay out, call the fire brigade and leave it to the professionals.



You need to stand at a distance of about 8 to 12 feet away from the flames. Standing closer is potentially dangerous and risks spreading the fire.

TRY TO REMEMBER PASS



PULL the safety pin, located at the top of the extinguisher.



AIM the extinguisher at the base of the fire.



SQUEEZE the handle to spray the contents.



Keep spraying to avoid re-ignition until the extinguisher contents have been fully discharged.

SPECIAL ADVICE FOR FOAM AND CO2 FIRE EXTINGUISHERS

Most extinguishers should be operated in the same way, although there are special guidelines for foam and Co2 extinguishers.

Care and attention should be exercised when using carbon dioxide fire extinguishers.

You must position the discharge horn before use, as during use this becomes very cold and touching it will result in freeze burns.

- Foam extinguishers should be aimed at the back edge of a fire instead of the base to be most effective.
- > For this reason, you must hold the handle, not the horn.

TAKEAWAY
